SETTING

A city council meeting room

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BLAKE. Tell me about it.

HANRATTY. It's been raining for two weeks.

BLAKE. I live here.

HANRATTY. My condolences.

PEEL. Thank you.

HANRATTY. You feeling all right? Aside from the obvious.

PEEL. I feel fine.

HANRATTY. You look peaked. ("Peaked" pronounced with one syllable.)

PEEL. I'm not sure you're saying that right.

HANRATTY. Ragged. ("Ragged" pronounced with one syllable.)

PEEL. No, I feel well. Yourself?

HANRATTY. Better than usual actually. Flush with positive ions.

BLAKE. You do look well.

HANRATTY. Thank you.

BLAKE. Very healthy.

HANRATTY. Thank you.

BLAKE. You eat nuts.

HANRATTY. Sorry?

BLAKE. You must eat nuts. They're the reason you look oily. Well-oiled.

HANRATTY. Okay.

BLAKE. Nuts have a lot of essential oils.

HANRATTY. Yes, I eat nuts.

PEEL. Listen, what is the story with Mr. Carp?

BLAKE. Peel's only now learning about Carp.

HANRATTY. Shame about Carp.

PEEL. Is it?

HANRATTY. Yes. I think so. A man down.

PEEL. Down how?

BLAKE. A bad man down is no tragedy.

PEEL. Mr. Carp isn't a bad man.

BLAKE. I didn't say he was.

HANRATTY. And I didn't say it was a tragedy. I said it was a shame.

PEEL. I'd like to know what happened, exactly –

HANRATTY. Hey, Peel, the accessible fountain is on the docket tonight.

PEEL. I told you I'd support that.

HANRATTY. Right, but is it half-hearted support? Is your attitude casual? I'd like to know I can count on you. I know it's not your bill. But it's a cause you can believe in.

PEEL. Yes, I believe in it. I believe in inclusion.

HANRATTY. Inclusion, right, I think it's important that we reach out to everybody.

PEEL. Everybody.

HANRATTY. I mean, the unrepresented.

BLAKE. No one's representing them.

HANRATTY. I still think we need to reach out to them, even if we don't have any of them on our board.

BLAKE. Because his sister is handicapped.

HANRATTY. My God, Blake, are you behind on the nomenclature. "Handicapped" went out with sodomy laws.

BLAKE. Don't we still have sodomy laws?

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HANRATTY. Hoop skirts.

(INNES enters from outside.)

BLAKE. I know, I know, the correct term is –

BLAKE.

HANRATTY.

"Impaired."

"Disabled."

BLAKE. "Impaired."

HANRATTY. "Disabled."

BLAKE. I don't think so, Harry.

HANRATTY. No, I'm certain about this. We reviewed the semantics.

BLAKE. Who's we? What kind of review?

HANRATTY. My guys. The accessible fountain men. We did a study.

PEEL. You have accessible fountain men?

HANRATTY. You can't get anything done on your own.

BLAKE. You did a study on the nomenclature?

HANRATTY. On the semantics.

BLAKE. What's the difference?

HANRATTY. Impairment is the source of disability.

BLAKE. No, what's the difference between semantics and nomenclature?

HANRATTY. They're different words. Look, Peel, I'm not asking you to wave a flag but any support you can give on behalf of the bill would be greatly appreciated. And your vote of course. Greatly appreciated.

PEEL. You have my support but I really want to get the story on Mr. Carp –

HANRATTY. What about you, Blake?
