support, Sassy, Studio 404 and Section 45, and Brian. Special thanks to Jo for letting me work with you on my last performance in Memphis.





and grateful for the opportunity to perform with New Moon.





ABOUT THE PLAY

The aging King Lear determines to split his domain evenly between his three daughters. When asked which daughter loves him best, the two oldest, Goneril and Regan, shower him with false flattery and love. Cordelia, the youngest daughter, refuses to pander to him and simply professes her love as a daughter should. In a rage, he disowns her and casts her out. Once the two remaining daughters have power over him they strip him of any remaining dignity. With that, Lear is pushed toward madness and his loyal followers must try to draw him back from the brink of destruction.

DIRECTOR'S CORNER



Anita "Jo" Lenhart earned her MFA in Directing from Florida State University in 1986. An associate professor at The University of Memphis, she has directed numerous productions for The Department of Theatre and Dance including *A Midsummer Night's Dream* and *The African Company Presents Richard III.* She has directed in Tallahassee, San Francisco,

Galveston and directed eight productions for the TN Governor's School for the Arts. Lenhart is also a professional actress and soprano soloist.

"I have been greatly humbled by the opportunity to work on this play and I am grateful to all who have made it possible. When asked why I was driven to mount this work, I answered the question many times from both artistic and academic perspectives. But only now, as I sit to write these notes, do I truly realize why. I dedicate this piece to my grandmother, Margaret Allen. She did not have Shakespeare's words to give voice to what she endured in facing the final storms of her own mortality. Such passages through life's seasons deserve to be honored and commemorated by great words. For her, for so many like her, - as well as for all of us who have been witness to a great life unraveling and confronted with having to choose our role in that real life tragedy - we need this story. We need these words."
