

This is the poignant story of Mrs. Watts, an aging widow living with her son and daughter-in-law in a three-room flat in Houston, Texas. Fearing that her presence may be an imposition on others, and chafing under the watchful eye of her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Watts imagines that if she can get away and return to her old home in the town of Bountiful, she is sure to regain her strength and dignity.

DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Randall T. Stevens (Director) is set to graduate this Spring from the University of Memphis with an MFA in Directing. Directing credits at U of M include Neighborhood 3: Requisition of Doom, The Normal Heart, And the World Goes 'Round, and Do Black Patent Leather Shoes Really Reflect Up? Randall comes to Memphis via Omaha, Nebraska, where he was an award-winning director and actor. 






New Moon Theatre Company was formed in 2004 to produce challenging works. It's first debut production of *Fefu and her Friends* was a wonderful success.
